Our speaker for the evening, author and historian Dr. John C. Carter, will be presenting an illustrated lecture about actions that resulted in a fascinating yet often overlooked chapter in the shared history of Canada. United States and Australia. He will cover events associated with the Upper Canadian Rebellion of 1838, and investigate the consequences of these rebellious acts on the main participants. Dr. Carter will describe the lives of the exiled "Patriots" while incarcerated in the Van Diemen's Land penal system, and detail their period of probation and time of freedom before their eventual release and return to Canada and the United States. The year 2013 is the 175th Anniversary of the event.

Archives Facilities project.....

Members will recall that in 2009, the Society undertook a project to make recommendations for a competent storage solution for the many public and private family and other collections in the County. On August 8th, 2012, David Armstrong led a presentation to the Huron County Council on the study and its recommendations to begin a Business Plan for an Archives building to serve the county. The presentation was well received.

Efforts are continuing to poll other Huron County municipal staffs to get a sense of volume to be accommodated and to begin a Business Case and Plan for space and storage needs.

Last meeting.....

Our meeting on May 15 was at the hall of the historic St Peters Evangelical Lutheran Church in Zurich and a visit to the restored Pioneer Cemetery nearby.

It was preceded by the Annual General Meeting and President's Report. David Armstrong advised members that in 2012, the Society held five General Meetings across the county, the Executive met an additional five times, and the Society published two editions of Historical Notes and had partaken in a number of County and other committees.

St Peter's was begun in the 1850s serving predominantly German families in the Zurich Area. Alma Westlake headed the presentation about the restored Cemetery dating back to the 1860s. A committee of five church ladies – Alma, Diane, Lois, Sharon and Michelle – spearheaded the opening of a Pioneer Cairn built in 1920 and restoration of the cemetery site. The Cairn contained what remained of tombstones at that time. The restored site displays those stone markers horizontally in an area surrounding a new upright black granite monument inscribed with the 134 names recorded as interred at the site.
